PVHS Expansion Project Update

The golden shovels were a great start to move the ground for the long-hoped museum expansion. However, they have been replaced with real equipment including excavators, trucks and workers. With the culmination of the rainy season, the green light was given for the soil beneath the expansion to be removed and replaced with compacted soil to support the new floor. The good news is that nothing below the area was found and that the approval of the new pad allows for the building permit to be issued.

In addition to the work out behind the museum, the front of the building is under a demolition process. That work allows for the structural upgrades and the new façade. The entry tower feature will provide for greater recognition for the motoring public along Las Posas Road.

This is only the beginning and begins to announce the anticipation and excitement for this project to better serve the Pleasant Valley community. Let's keep the excitement going! Help us with the work and funding for the next phases of the project. Check out the videos on the PVHS website which shows the project in greater detail. And tell your friends about the opportunities for their help with this project as well.

President's Message

Our PVHS board has added five members in the last year. Beth Miller has been taking our programs to schools as well as local clubs and organizations. She has amazing knowledge of the area. Mary Goldberg comes with a long background of the community and is on the Camarillo Ranch Foundation Board. Mary Ann Novak joined us April and is already working as the leader of an ad-hoc committee. She has been working with us for the past 4 years. Eric Bergh has been doing our promotional videos for over a year and joined the board in June. Also, in June, Rick Pena brought his community involvement to PVHS. Born and raised in Camarillo, he is part of the "Pena clan". A local realtor, Rick has recently completed the Miracle League of the 805 project to provide a baseball field for people with disabilities. We lost long-time board member John Pearson in June. Always together, John and his wife, Beverly, have been an integral part of PVHS and other local organizations for many years.

The long-awaited start of construction has begun with demolition! The front and back walls, roof and doors are all gone. The inside has been braced to hold the remainder of the roof and a new roof will eventually be in place. The pad for the new addition has been compacted and ready for the slab. We need to raise the additional funds for stage 2 and 3. I was recently asked "why" we were building when other museums are turning into art or single focus displays. We have the history of the Pleasant Valley and want people to know our unique history. The space to have programs in the museum has been taken by collections. We will be bringing programs back...such as the early American school days that we had before Covid 19. We want a museum of interaction and learning. That requires space. We believe that history moves forward and we have programs reflecting the 40s and 50s as well as a new collection from Robert Olszewski that is unique to Camarillo. He began his business of bronze miniatures in the early 80s.

Understanding the past helps us prepare for and protect the future. We need your help and contributions to the building fund to meet the costs of the new phases of building.

PVHS Expansion Project Update Photos



North-East corner view of the museum building. The east wall (Mural wall) and west wall will be extended north to match the length of the roof. A new side entrance door location will be added to the east wall to replace the previous side entrance door. Lisa Kelly, who did the original Mural, will be commissioned to match her Mural to the new east wall layout.



North/Front view of the museum building. The front wall will be moved north to match the length of the roof. A temporary wall has been added inside the building to support the weight of the roof until the new front wall is installed. The front entrance will be a tower two stories tall to increase museum building visibility, and appearance, from Las Posas Road.




Museum Expansion Fundraising: Sponsoring a Personalized Brick




